
- Fathers play a vital role in parenting during the early years (0-5 years) of a child's life, contributing to their development and well-being.

- Involved fathers contribute to more equitable parenting partnerships, enhanced communication between parents, and increased satisfaction and stability within the family unit.




Father-Child Bonding

- By actively participating in shared parenting and co-parenting, fathers demonstrate their commitment to being loving and involved parents, benefiting the well-being of their children.


Father's Role in Nurturing and Caregiving


- Active involvement in nurturing and caregiving tasks is essential for fathers to strengthen their bond with their children.
